






Large carnivores: Carpathian cooperation

- Lynx, wolf and bear as keystone species
- Carpathians host abundant native populations
- Carpathian Convention → Protocol on Biodiversity & Biodiversity Working Group → International Action Plan on the conservation of large carnivores and ensuring ecological connectivity
- Need for coordinated transnational cooperation & harmonised policies and data collection & joint conservation approaches








Transboundary Pilot Areas

- 2. Tatra Mountains (SK PL)
- 3. East Carpathians (PL SK UA)
- 4. Slovak Karst North Hungarian Mountains (SK HU)







Activities and Outcomes



- Setting the scene for large carnivore conservation in the Carpathians → Thematic Guidances
- Comprehensive, sustainable **system of monitoring** of large wolves, bears, lynxes
- Joint solutions to tackle <u>poaching</u> and resolve <u>human-carnivore conflicts</u> across the Carpathians
- Recommendations for the revision of the International Action Plan on the conservation of large carnivores and ensuring ecological connectivity
- Multi-stakeholder engagement and policy, education and public roll-out of project findings
- Scaling up towards the Alpine region and the EU level
- Next steps: consultations within the Carpathian and Alpine Conventions + joint conference in Slovenia, March 2024





Key messages & links





- Long-term co-existence between people and large carnivores in the Carpathians cannot be achieved without transnational cooperation.
- Need for improvement of evidence-based policy frameworks for biodiversity and their implementation at local, regional and transnational level.
