The BIOREGIO Carpathians project, recently approved and the EU South East Europe European Territorial Cooperation Programme, that will further develop these projects and initiatives, will be officially launched during the side event. Side Event: CARPIVIA: Carpathian integrated assessment of vulnerability to climate change and ecosystem-based adaptation measures The CARPIVIA project aims to assess the vulnerability of the Carpathian region to climate change in combination with other anthropogenic pressures. The main objectives of the side event are: to inform of CARPIVIA (background, objectives, planning - in particular the aim to provide a knowledge platform) and to start discussion with participants on providing a knowledge platform about vulnerability to climate change and ecosystem based adaptation options for the Carpathians (and how this could support Carpathian Convention and national policy initiatives).
