- Geographic area: 190.600 km².
- Mostly mountain areas but several big urban centers.
- Home to about **14 million people**, 30,000 animal species and 13,000 plant species.
- Mostly soft law: no binding enforcement system;
 Compliance Committee controls if the commitments and obligations resulting from the Alpine Convention are complied with.
- Millions of tourist every year.











 - First activities already lined up with the SCC

Cooperation between the Alpine and Carpathian Convention

- Memorandum of Understanding (since 2006)
- Regular exchanges between the Conventions (participation at COPs)
- Regular exchanges between the Secretariats
- Joint activities between our Protected areas (CNPA & Alparc)
- Joint activities on international level (UNFCCC COPs, Mountain Partnership etc.)
- Possibly follow up activities on the ,priority topics' (Women in mountain areas; Climate change)
