







CNPA Questionnaire 2022

Large mountain ranges of Europe, such as the Carpathians, run across a number of countries, irrespective of political borders. They harbour enormous biodiversity values of the common European and global importance. However, natural areas shared by neighbouring countries are not only a common treasure but also a common responsibility.

Protected areas networks allow for a more effective and harmonized management of the shared natural heritage, habitats and species, as well as for joint preservation and promotion of cultural values of the region. Neighbouring countries, which often have different levels of technical expertise, knowledge, capacity and financial resources, can benefit by combining their respective strengths through transboundary cooperation.

The Carpathian Network of Protected Areas (CNPA) established in 2006 constitutes a regional thematic network of cooperation of mountain-protected areas in the Carpathians. As an official instrument of the Carpathian Convention, CNPA aims at contributing to the protection and sustainable development of the Carpathians, and in particular to achieve the goals listed in Article 4 of the Carpathian Convention and its Protocol on Biodiversity.

The CNPA Steering Committee composed of representatives designated by the governments of all Carpathian countries is currently tasked with reconsidering the governance structure of the CNPA and preparing a new Action Plan for the network, so the network is fit and fully operational for a year of cooperation to come.

In order to support CNPA Steering Committee in these ambitious tasks, we kindly ask you, the representative of a Carpathian protected area - CNPA members – to answer the below questionnaire until **the June 6**th **2022**. This would greatly help to design the future of the network according to your needs and expectations.




