DECISION COP6/3 Cooperation with the European Union

Implementing the Road Map towards the accession of the European Union to the Carpathian Convention adopted at the COP6

ONGOING/ACCOMPLISHED

- Ongoing consultation between the Parties, the Secretarait and relevant actors
- 6th Meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Carpathian Convention (COP6) - 25 November 2020
 - The COP6 reiterates the invitation for the EU to accede to the Carpathian Convention, and adopts relevant decisions in this respect
 - Poland officially announced that the EU accession to the Carpathian Convention is the Presidency priority
- Poland in its capacity of the CC Presidency sent the letter to the Commissioner for Environment informing about the COP6 Decisions

NEXT STEPS

- Establishing a dialog with the EU Commission regarding the EU accession to the Convention (for this EU Commission should designate a focal point)
- Ministerial Conference of the Carpathian Convention 2021, Poland (tbc)
 - official request (tbc) for the accession of the European Union to the Carpathian Convention made by the Heads of Delegations (in a form of a declaration or a letter) ideally in the presence of the Commissioner/other EU representative

EU Environmental Council - 2021/2022

• official request made by the Polish Presidency of the Carpathian Convention to the EU Environmental Council for the accession of the European Union to the Carpathian Convention

Cooperation with the European Union

Concrete CCIC recommendations for action (draft by the Secretariat)

- CCIC requests the Parties to actively implement the Road Map towards the accession of the European Union to the Carpathian Convention and requests the Secretariat to support the process.
- CCIC invites/requests the Parties to consider the introduction of/to introduce a "Regional Economic Integration Organization Clause" into the Carpathian Convention in a form of an amendment of the Convention, which shall allow for the EU accession to the Carpathian Convention (Romania asked for clarifying this proposal)



DECISION COP6/4 Cooperation with United Nations Environment Programme

The Secretariat continues participating in the meeting of the UNEP Focal Points for Multilateral Environmental Agreements supporting:

- Promotion of the Carpathian Convention, its objectives and ongoing activities at the UN forum
- Consideration of potential areas for future cooperation in the light of respective mandates of the Convention and UNEP strengthening programmatic cooperation
- Together with UNEP supporting implementation of the project - Building national biodiversity information supply and demand in Pan Europe to support implementation & progress review of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework


Cooperation with the Alpine Convention:

- Regular contact seeking further opportunities for cooperation and common activities
- Mutual representation at relevant meetings
- Continued expert exchange with the Alpine Biodiversity Board and the Alpine Climate Board
- New Alpine Convention Working Group on Natural Hazards proposed an exchange of experiences and knowledge between the regions on natural hazards related to the mountain areas.

- Mountain Biodiversity Day, 13 January 2021, was hosted by the outgoing French Presidency of the Alpine Convention in cooperation with UNEP and the Carpathian Convention
- The Carpathians represented by the Polish Presidency



- Updating the trilateral Memorandum of Cooperation between the CBD, Alpine Convention and the Carpathian Convention
 - draft MoC in consultation w CBD Secretariat
 - to be signed ideally at the Carpathian Ministerial Conference in Poland 2022
- Invitation to join the Forum Alpinum focused on mountain biodiversity, 15-17 December 2021 in Bolzano and online



DECISION COP6/5 Cooperation with other conventions and international bodies

UN Resolution - Nature knows no borders: transboundary cooperation – a key factor for biodiversity conservation, restoration and sustainable use

- adopted by the United Nations General Assembly at its 75th session held on 16 April 2021
- recognizes the Carpathian Convention as a regional initiative supporting cooperation and transboundary approaches in respect to biodiversity conservation, restoration and sustainable use
- further impetus for the Carpathian Convention work on biodiversity and ecological connectivity in the Carpathian region, and, moreover, initiate further exchange and cooperation with various actors and initiative

Cooperation with the Mountain Partnership

regularly exchange with the Mountain Partnership, especially on further strengthening the visibility of the mountain regions on the political agendas, including within the on the Post-2020 GBF and UN Decade on Restoration



Promoting the Carpathian Convention

- Presenting the Carpathian Convention as a good example at various meetings, including:
 - Regional Dialogue on Governance in the Andes and Mountain Regions on 27-28 April 2021
 - Regional Dialogues on the Integral Management of Páramos and other High Mountain Ecosystems, coorganized by CONDESAN on 21 October



DECISION COP6/8 Strengthening science-policy-practice interface and cooperation with scientific networks

Strengthening the cooperation with the Science for the Carpathians:

- collaborating with S4C in the implementation of the project, "Linking Science, Policy And People For Sustainable Carpathians", funded by the Visegrad Fund
- supported the organization of the 6th Forum Carpaticum Conference, focused on Linking the Environmental, Political and Societal Aspects for Carpathian Sustainability and coorganized several sessions and workshops during the Forum
- co-organized a ceremony of signing the Memorandum of Understanding for the Cooperation between the S4C and the SNCmt,

- facilitated participation of an S4C lecturer in a Caucasus Summer School, organized by the SNC-mt, which took place on 20-24 September 2021, focused on disaster risk management, identifying and assessing mountain hazards and their causes, as well as in the summer School IPROMO 2021 - Post COVID-19 Recovery in Mountain Areas, organized by the Mountain Partnership
- supported the S4C in collecting and assembling recommendations for the Carpathian Convention and for the Research Agenda for the Carpathians

due to the closer collaboration by the Secretariat staff and the S4C, the S4C has proposed including the Secretariat representative in the Executive Committee of the Network




DECISION COP6/13 Sustainable Forest Management

Carpathian Route - exploring, promoting and protecting the richness of the cultural and natural heritage of the Carpathian Region

The project funding was cancelled in September 2020 by EEA and Norway Grants Fund for Regional Cooperation due to political reasons

Ongoing consultation on a possibility to restore the project by the Lead Partner – the Marshal Office of the Podkarpackie Region





DECISION COP6/17 Environmental assessment/information system, monitoring and early warning

Carpathian Integrated Biodiversity Information System (CCIBIS)

- Continuing cooperation with various partners (WWF CEE, SPECTRA, towards installation of the CCIBIS within the Carpathian Convention server.
- Continuing cooperation with the EEA for further development and integration of the CCIBIS into EU/EEA information systems.
