
**Duration:** Dec 2008 - June 2012 Sequel:

**Budget:** 1,8 Million Euro (1,4 Million Euro ERDF)

### The Region:

Eastern edge of the Alp – Danube  
floodplains - Morava - Lesser  
carpathians

- Protected areas/ stepping stones
- Fragmented areas (esp. Vienna-Bratislava)



## Main Aim - Ecological connectivity


along historical migration route

with protected areas

- Safeguarding populations of wild animals and flora (genetical exchange, Metapopulation-konzept)
- Ensurance for protected areas
- The project also wants to trigger a sustainable development which considers the requirements of both man and wildlife.



## Project structure




## Groundwork : Creating the basis for future implementation


GIS modelling of the whole AKK area, Detailed Corridor modell of bottleneck sections





## Developments since then...

- Increasing of awareness of AKK/MoU on various levels: EU, global level (UNEP/Annual Report), regional and national level, Carpathian Convention
- Inspiration for similar action in other areas
- Increasing awareness for topic green infrastructure
- Development of certain follow-up activities in frame of AKK Centrope Add on: further steps towards implementation of AKK (building on existing networks and partnerships)

## Green Infrastructure

- Increasing awareness for topic in particular on EU level (recent communication of EC) AKK as best-practise example, case study (Institute for European Environmental Policy (IEEP))
- Thematic workshops: e.g. "Transportation Infrastructure and Wildlife Corridors – learning from experience", Luhacovice (Czech Republic) 16- 18 October 2013
- → needed action towards implementation of AKK MoU, defining synergies with Strategic Action Plan (WWF Austria and Daphne SK)

## The way ahead ...

- More than 1 ½ years since endorsement of AKK MoU
- **Take steps towards implementation of AKK MoU (long-term sustainability of AKK project and ensuring commitment by stakeholders beyond life-time of project)**
- Analysis of activities undertaken contributing to implementation of AKK MoU (various levels)
- Analysis of concrete needs for further action defining strong synergies with Action Plan (gap analysis)

Objective: informal „reporting“ on relevant activities and outcomes, definition of concrete actions to be taken (poss. for next programming period)



## Meeting of the informal ad-hoc WG AKK MoU, 11 November 2013

- Main Stakeholders: representatives that signed the MoU (ASFINAG, NDS, Lower Austria, Burgenland, Trnava and Bratislava regions, etc..) civil society (WWF, Daphne), and other interested stakeholders
- **Objective:** Assessment of overall activities contributing to implementation of MoU and identification of gaps, needed activities (focus on transboundary aspects) possible recommendations for follow up project(s) under next SK AT programme period (idea of poss. "AKK sequel"), agreement on possible way forward (establishment of AKK MoU in long term perspective after projects end)

## Taking stock

- Multi-sectoral, crossborder strengthened partnership (involvement of motorway companies)
- Scientific based developed strategies and approaches to develop/re-establish a green corridor
- High-level commitment to project to ensure sustainability
- High visibility at different levels (flagship project)
- Possible sequel for new programming period and replication in other areas of Carpathians? → EU Danube Strategy: “

*Action - “To develop green infrastructure in order to connect different bio-geographic regions and habitats”.*
