

There is a wealth of knowledge generated by the 122 transnational partnerships supported by the South East Europe Programme. But while creating synergies between projects and capitalising on results of previous initiatives has been an underlying principle for all approved projects, the approach to do this has not been streamlined so far. In order to respond to this challenge and to a demand from our beneficiaries, the SEE Programme developed a capitalisation strategy that puts projects at the heart of the process.
