SARNANO (MC), 23-24 APRIL 2014

The Italian Presidency of the Alpine Convention for 2013-2014 is organizing the International Conference "<u>The</u> <u>Alpine Convention and the Carpathian Convention: sharing the experiences. The Apennines, a European</u> <u>mountain range</u>".

The Conference is organized in collaboration with the United Nation Environment Program and Interim Secretariat of the Carpathian Convention (UNEP Wien - ISCC), the European Academy of Bolzano (EURAC), the Italian ESPON Contact Point, the University of Camerino, the Italian Alpine Club (CAI), the Sarnano local group of CAI and Sarnano Municipality.

The conference will be held the 23rd and 24th April in Sarnano (MC) in conjunction with the celebration of the 30th anniversary of the foundation of the Italian Alpine Club group of Sarnano.

In the framework of the activities of mountain cooperation for the sustainable development of mountain areas conducted by the Alpine Convention, the Conference intends to compare international experiences on negotiation, governance and scientific debate gained in the Alps and the Carpathian regions so that this experiences can be shared with other mountain regions such as the Apennine.

The Conference addresses territorial authorities at national, regional and local level, the national and international scientific community and other stakeholders. It envisages an introduction to Alpine and Carpathian Conventions's experiences and a scientific debate on the landscape value of the Apennines, to recognize their role as a European mountain range.

The debate will focus also on the European Programmes for mountain areas, it will present international research and, in particular, the outcomes of the research "Access2Mountain - Sustainable mobility and tourism in sensitive areas of the Alps and Carpathians" (South East Europe).

During the conference a session dedicated to the project "ESPON on the Road" will be held, that sees Italy as the coordinator of the Mediterranean States (Spain, French, Italy, Greece and Romania). In this context, the Italian ESPON Contact Point will chair a specific workshop dedicated to the participation of the Alpine and the Apennine Regions.

The aim of the event is to identify some themes and innovative paths for mountain policies and to improve the management of the mountain environment as a resource, in order to start a dialogue and to provide an international framework where the value of the Apennines landscapes can be understood and enhanced.
