
The Alpine Convention




First international treaty for the protection and sustainable development of a mountain range

Area and Scope of the Population of the Alpine Convention

Background of the WISO working group

- The WISO working group was set up by the Alpine conference in 2009.
- Members: nominated experts from the Contracting parties and Observers
- Chair: Member states Currently Slovenia
- Mandates for two-year periods

Work of WISO

- Ministry representatives experts from 7 countries discuss management of large carnivores in the Alps
- Topics connected with ungulate management are part of the discussions

Challenges

- Mechanisms for financing concrete ideas projects
- Implementation of the results in the member states

Concrete example



- Planed preparation of strategic guidelines for bear management in the project area
- Participation of all Alpine countries through WISO platform was insured
- Implementation into national strategic documents
