



Virgin forests in Romania







- December 2011 the minister of environment signed a protocol for their protection

Forest Management

Responsible Forest Management – forest certification

1. Global High Conservation Value Forests (HCVF) Toolkit adapted for Romania and Ukraine.

2. Field identification of HCVF in Romania and Ukraine – ca 2 million hectares surveyed for HCVF.


3. FSC certification of forest management for state and private forests (700,000 ha certified, 1.9 million ha in progress).

4. Chain of Custody (CoC) FSC certification for wood processing companies (86 companies in Romania in 2011).

4. Training for foresters and NGO's on responsible forest management.

5. Development of Integrated Forest Management Planning (IFMP).

6. Improved forestry legislation in Romania

- Forest Law Enforcement Governance and Trade -FLEGT


SUMAL tracking tool in Romania, possible adaptation in Ukraine
