"adopted the **Carpathian Biodiversity Framework** and the accompanying Carpathian Vision 2050, translating the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF) at the regional level, as a comprehensive and ambitious instrument to implement transformative actions by various stakeholders in order to achieve a vision to live in harmony with nature in the Carpathians by 2050".

Support the implementation of the Carpathian Biodiversity Framework
Mandate: COP7 Decision COP7/6 para 1 and COP7/9 para 2
Envisaged activities
- Act upon CBF Strategic Objective 1 while considering its connections to other Strategic Objectives, implementing ongoing activities and proposing new initiatives accordingly.
- Consider the annex of the Carpathian Biodiversity Framework, which outlines actions for implementing the GBF in the Carpathian region. These actions contribute to each relevant Global Target and support the achievement of the Vision 2030 for the Carpathians and the Strategic Objective by 2030.
- Consider and integrate the results of the NaturaConnect project into the implementation of the Carpathian Biodiversity Framework

- Contribute to the development of the thematic guidance on monitoring, poaching investigation and conflict prevention and the recommendations for the implementation of the Carpathian Convention on large carnivores by actively consulting and providing expert inputs to the documents.

Support conservation of the Carpathian lynx
Mandate: COP7 Decision: COP7/9 para 19
COP7/9 para 19: Takes note of the development and submission of a proposal on Concerted Action for the Eurasian Lynx under the CMS Convention
Envisaged activities:
- Develop, endorse and implement a Strategy for the conservation of the autochthonous population of the Carpathian lynx in Europe in close cooperation with the Range States and relevant bodies of Bern Convention and CMS to inform the development and implementation of related National Action Plans (to be further specified)

Reestablish the Large Carnivores Expert Group within the WG Biodiversity

Envisaged activities:

Increase interregional cooperation on large carnivores

Mandate: COP7 Decision: COP7/9 para 4

Envisaged activities:

Consider and use the results of the Joint Conference of the Alpine and the Carpathian Conventions on large carnivores, organized within the frame of the LAEC project in March 2024 in Slovenia, and based on it, suggest and develop joint activities between the Carpathian and Alpine regions, not limited to other regions, for improving the conservation and management practices of large carnivores in the respective regions and in Europe.

Implement the Joint Declaration "Achieving functional biodiversity in the Danube-Carpathian Region by mainstreaming ecological connectivity

Mandate: COP7 Decision: COP7/9 para 6

Envisaged activities:

Initiate and implement activities supporting the implementation of the Joint Declaration "Achieving functional biodiversity in the Danube-Carpathian Region by mainstreaming ecological connectivity.

Support implementation of NaturaConnect project building a resilient ecological network of conserved areas across Europe

Mandate: COP7 Decision: COP7/9 para 7

Envisaged activities:

- Contribute to and support the project activities relevant for the Carpathians by providing expert inputs and consulting project documents and tools, as requested.
- Participate and contribute to the workshops and webinars organized within the frame of the NaturaConnect project, which aims to provide relevant data and tools for establishing a robust ecological network comprising green and blue infrastructure, with consideration for potential financing mechanisms within the Carpathian region.

- Use and promote the results of the project SaveGREEN on safeguarding the functionality of transnationally important ecological corridors in the Danube region, particularly the "Methodology on Monitoring structural and functional ecological connectivity" and its related application toolbox for field data collection.
- Use and promote the results of the ConnectGREEN project, particularly:
 - Methodology for identification of ecological corridors in the Carpathian countries using large carnivores as umbrella species
 - Guidelines on how to Use Spatial Planning Tool in Integrative Management of Ecological Corridors.
