



Our mission

Foundation Conservation Carpathia's mission is to create Europe's largest forest wilderness National Park in the Romanian Făgăraș Mountains as a complete and self-sustaining ecosystem, which benefits nature and people whilst mitigating climate change.






We are here!







1. Ecological restoration

- From the beginning of the project, almost 25.000 ha of forests and alpine pastures in the S-E of the Carpathian Mountains are protected from exploitation.
- The foundation is planting almost 100 ha every year, taking into consideration the missing key species. Most of the trees planted are from our tree nurseries.
- We restored the old exploitation roads that had become massive ditches.
- Since 2019, we started a programme to eliminate invasive alien plant species.









2. Wildlife & Wildlife monitoring

- We are currently active throughout five wildlife management units and we have created an area of 78,000 ha where trophy and sports hunting is completely prohibited.
- We are actively working on solving human-wildlife problems, such as bears attacks. We offered electric fences for shepards and we developed a compensation programme for the people who lost domestic animals in wildlife conflicts.
- The foundation is actively monitoring wildlife with modern technology. We work with three categories of field methods: wildlife tracking, genetic sample collection, and remote camera traps.
- We reintroduced 2 key species in the Făgăraș Mountains, long lost because excessive hunting, the European beaver (castor fiber) and the European bison (bison bonasus).

We also craft beer, but the most important: we develop economic incentives for local communities and prove that a protected area is more beneficial for them than the current, extractive economy.






Eco-tourism

We develop an eco-tourism infrastructure, based on wildlife, forests, and re-wilding for the future National Parc Fagaras:

- We are building visitor centers, thematic trails
- We have four wildlife hides, one glamping, guest houses, an educational center
- Ecoturism program Travel Carpathia
- Guiding Academy
