To places where nature and people move as one since ancient times. Where stately trees seem to brush the deep blue sky.


Clouds billow to form majestic peaks. The songs of birds fill the air, creating symphony upon symphony.






What are the Carpathian Peace Parks?

contribute to global peace and ecological sustainability.




A Mindful Journey With Purpose Through Nature

Biodiversity

- Carpathians = Europe's center of biodiversity.
- Habitats: Old-growth forests, alpine meadows, riparian corridors.
- Flagship species: lynx, bear, wolf, capercaillie, black stork and golden eagle.
- Is connecting existing protected areas in Ukraine. Requires enlargement of some and creation of new ones from scratch in Romania in the area of Izvoarele Sucevei.
- A living biosphere that supports both biodiversity and communities.



Climate Change Resilience

Carpathian Peace Parks administrations will aim to:

- Maintain the native forests = natural carbon deposits
- Promote regenerative agriculture among communities
- Supports IUCN, Carpathian Convention, IPBES and EU Biodiversity Strategy goals





Cultural Heritage

- Hutsul, Romanian, and Ukrainian traditions coexisting for centuries
- Architecture, land use, language, foodways, music
- Sacred forests, shepherd trails, cross-border village ties
- Conservation built with, not around, communities
